LAKE MANAGEMENT REPORT FALL 2016

Hello again as another great summer at the lake winds down. As you read my lake report, you have undoubtedly noticed a common theme in my opening line-the weather. There are a couple of reasons for this. I work outside, and more importantly, it plays a huge roll on our lake. Today is July 24th, and the heat index outside is about 100 degrees! I sweat profusely in this kind of heat and since I have spent the last week doing just that, I thought this would be a great day to sit in the A.C. and write this report.

As I mentioned last spring, work will begin on the cave leak very soon. Mainline Excavating has set a tentative start date for mid-August. The project will take one to two weeks to complete. I feel that it would be negligent on my part not to remind you that there can be no guarantee of success on this repair. I am, however, confident that the methods used on other leaks will also work on this leak. I will give a full report on this project at the fall meeting. I really hope to have good news for you by then.

The silt pond projects that I discussed last spring are on hold for now. Funding for these will not be available until late winter or early spring at which time we will move forward with these projects.

On June 26th lake management committee (LMC) held a meeting. About twelve people attended this meeting. We covered several topics. The two main topics that affect all of us were the geese and the aquatic weed problem. One solution for the goose problem is a goose light. The light is an amber flashing light at the goose's eye level. We placed one at the beach and it is very effective at night. The problem is, they come back during the day. LMC will work with the IDNR in the coming months to come up with a solution before the geese return in the spring. We also formed a sub-committee to look into a better solution to the aquatic vegetation problem in the lake. Dave Merrill is the chairman of this committee. Dave is looking into several options to reduce this problem. We are hopeful that the grass carp will eventually be able to control the vegetation. At this time they are too small to eat enough to be an effective control. We will discuss some of these options at the fall meeting.

The final subject of this report is on funding of these projects. On behalf of the LMC and roads I would like to thank everyone who attended the spring meeting and voted. The vote for the dues increase passed by an overwhelming majority, (94-21). As I stated before the vote, the Kirchhoff family would contribute an initial investment of \$10,000. per year for the first three years if the dues increase passed. They held up their end of the bargain by sending their first installment on July 11th. This money will be used to complete funding on the cave leak repair. None of this would be possible without your support. Please check out the LLPOA website from time to time for updates on projects and events at the lake. I hope to see all of you at the fall meeting. Enjoy the rest of your summer. I guess I'll close this for now, it's getting cloudy and a nice breeze is blowing. I think I'll go outside and enjoy it while it lasts.

SECURITY

Remember to watch the speed limit, ALWAYS have the correct amount of persons per seats on your NLV, and drive safely while on the four wheelers. Security will be in full force this summer, so remember to have your stickers in your cars and stickers and flags on your NLVs. If you need a flag, we will have them available for sale for the low price of \$10 – contact any board member if you need one or for more information! If you have guests, make sure they have guest passes! Anyone who does not have a guest pass will be escorted to the nearest gate. (Remember, if your guests break any rules, YOU will be held accountable! Your guests are YOUR responsibility!)

The final lake wide sale of the season will be held this Labor Day weekend. Participants are encouraged throughout the lake to have a garage sale Friday, Saturday and Sunday during the hours of 8:00 am and 3:00 pm.
