Sewer Hook-ups

Frank Freiburg/Jackson County Sanitation: Frank will be at Leisure Lake periodically inspecting member's sewers to ensure they are legally installed and will also be making sure all the old septic's have been properly pumped. Kruser Septic Services can be contacted at (608) 568-3000 for a pumping quote; you will need to pay at time of service. In addition, if there is more than one permanent structure/camper on your property, and only one sewer hookup has been installed on that property, then only one structure/camper can stay on that property.

- A very big reminder! If you are going to dig, you need to call contact Iowa One Call at Iowaonecall.com, Phone: 811 or 1-800-292-8989 And Mark Schneider (ECIA/ EIRRUS) for the Grinder lines at 563-690-5770. If you don't call and you sever a line of some sort, then it is YOUR responsibility to pay the fine and to have the line fixed.
- Keep in contact with your Precinct Director. If you have any questions or concerns, they will be able to address them for you. If they don't have the answer, they will find out and get back to you with the information. Check with your Precinct Director regarding your precinct meetings. These will also be posted on the website.

WATERCRAFTS

Any watercraft used at Leisure Lake must have a current LLPOA registration and valid sticker attached within viewable site or you will be asked to remove it from the water immediately. No overnight parking/storage is allowed on any LLPOA property including the boat launch areas. Please report any violations to security or to any board member.

SECURITY

Remember to watch the speed limit, ALWAYS have the correct amount of persons per seats on your NLV, and drive safely while on the four wheelers. Security will be in full force this summer, so remember to have your stickers in your cars and stickers and flags on your NLVs. If you need a flag, we will have them available for sale for the low price of \$10 – contact any board member if you need one or for more information! If you have guests, make sure they have guest passes! Anyone who does not have a guest pass will be escorted to the nearest gate. Lake Management Report Fall 2018

Greetings from your Lake Management Committee.

Hello again from your Lake Management Committee (LMC). We had a pretty good summer as far as the lake goes. Algae blooms were minimal, water clarity has been good, both of which are results of silt ponds functioning properly. We will continue to improve the quality of our lake if we can further control run off in the rest of our water shed. We don't have a lot to report on that yet, but hopefully we will in the spring. You will be the first to know when we do.

Mainline Excavating was here in late June for a site assessment and planning meeting for repair of the cave leak. We will attempt this repair, most likely in the fall. As I've mentioned before there are no guaranties of success. I will state that our confidence is high.

LMC also stocked 92 flat head catfish in the lake in June. These fish range in size from 3-20 lbs. Our hope is that they will help control the green sunfish population. We ask that you release these fish if you catch them. These fish were stocked after consulting with a biologist from the IDNR. It has also come to our attention that permission from the IDNR is required to stock any species of fish in our lake. I would say to anyone who is thinking of taking it upon themselves to put fish, or anything else, in the lake, don't do it. It could get very expensive for them.

I have touched on several of our bigger topics in this article. There's a lot more to talk about and I will at the fall meeting. I hope to see all of you there.
