Ditching, grading and stone resurfacing has been done on Pleasant, Collins and West Circle. Plans are moving forward for both the ditching, grading and partial Asphalt Paving of Cedar Street and seal coat patching is planned for the fall. In addition, a new pavilion is currently being constructed at the Daisy beach which will provide additional shade, picnic area and parking for our members. It is the intent of this board to finish these projects this year.

On another note, the survey results are in for our coordinated buildings and grounds lake color. Members have decided on Blue and the board will be working to repaint the Pair Street bathrooms/office and storage garage. In addition, new exterior and interior paint and aluminum wrapping of trim will be undertaken at Daisy Beach and other buildings. We thank all members for their input, help and donations and are excited about the new look we will be bringing to the lake.

On the issue of Boat, Auto and NLV tags, the board will be replacing all tags this upcoming year at no additional cost to members. Keeping with our new Lake Color scheme the board will be issuing all members new tags for the 2019 – 2020 season. These stickers will be standardized, reflective and will feature a Blue background with White numbers and letters.

As always there is not enough space or time to fill you in on all our plans and improvements, but I encourage you to come to our annual fall meeting and let your thoughts be heard. As always, I am guaranteeing a maximum 2-hour meeting. If you can't get it done in that amount of time you haven't prepared. Have a great summer and fall.

Sewer Hook-ups Phase II

Jackson County Sanitation will be at Leisure Lake this year inspecting members' sewers making sure they are legally installed and will also be making sure all the old septic's are properly pumped and filled in. If there is more than one permanent structure/camper on your property, and only one sewer hookup, only one structure/camper can stay.

In addition, we have been made aware that Jackson County has received a grant to help with finishing up the remaining 25 private pump stations for the lake. As of July 24th, 22 grinders have been reserved for installation and only 3 remain available. No other specifics are available at this time.

May 2019 through October 2020 – Weekends (Garbage Bags and Insect Control Spray Provided)

- Check Trash at Beach and Pavilion, and, remove filled trash bags and take to dumpsters.
- Replace garbage bags in all trash containers.

September 2019 through August 2020 – Daily (Garbage Bags and Insect Control Spray Provided)

- Pickup loose trash items around dumpster area.
- Inspect each dumpster for illegal items and report to Security all observed illegal dumping.
- Spray dumpsters periodically for fly's and insects.
