Lake Management Report Fall 2017

I would like to start this article with some good news and some bad news. The good news is, the level of the lake stayed fairly high this year. For the bad news, read the last sentence again. The lake had dropped enough that we were close to the level that we needed to do the cave leak repair using the method described last spring. That changed drastically on July 22nd when nearly 6 inches of rain fell raising the lake to its highest level since January. The high-water level makes it much too risky and much more expensive to attempt at this time. Unless we suddenly have severe drought conditions for the next few months we will have to wait till next year.

The silt pond projects we discussed last spring have not been completed as of the writing of this article. This project should be completed before the fall meeting. I will give a full report at that time.

To all of you fishermen out there, we stocked 2,000 walleyes, 500 channel cat, and 30 grass carp this summer. I would like to remind all of you that we do not budget money for fish. This expense is funded by your purchase of boat stickers. The sticker on your boat also helps identify your boat if it gets loose during high water events or high wind events. This is a very common occurrence at our lake. Stickers also help us determine if boats on the lake belong to members. No one has to ask if you belong on the lake if your sticker is properly displayed. One more thing about boat stickers, when you buy them, put them on your boat. We cannot see them if you leave them in your cabin.

I suppose I have rambled on enough about boat stickers. I have several topics to discuss with you at the fall meeting. One of them is the quantity of silt entering our lake. I think the numbers will shock you. Please plan to attend the meeting. See you there. Del

Sewer Hook-ups

Frank Freiburg/ Jackson County Sanitation: Frank will be at Leisure Lake periodically inspecting member's sewers to ensure they are legally installed and will also be making sure all the old septic's have been properly pumped. Kruser Septic Services can be contacted at (608) 568-3000 for a pumping quote; you will need to pay at time of service. In addition, if there is more than one permanent

structure/camper on your property, and only one sewer hookup has been installed on that property, then only one structure/camper can stay on that property.

- A very big reminder! If you are going to dig, you need to call contact Iowa One Call at Iowaonecall.com, Phone: 811 or 1-800-292-8989 and Mark Schneider (ECIA/ EIRRUS) for the Grinder lines at 563-690-5770. If you don't call and you sever a line of some sort, then it is YOUR responsibility to pay the fine and to have the line fixed.
- Keep in contact with your Precinct Director. If you have any questions or concerns, they will be able to address them for you. If they don't have the answer, they will find out and get back to you with the information. Check with your Precinct Director regarding your precinct meetings. These will also be posted on the website.

SECURITY

Remember to watch the speed limit, ALWAYS have the correct number of persons per seats on your NLV, and drive safely while on the four wheelers. Security will be in full force for the remainder of the summer, so remember to have your stickers in your cars and stickers and flags on your NLVs. If you need a flag, we will have them available for sale for the low price of \$10 – contact Treasurer Jennifer! If you have guests, make sure they have guest passes! Anyone who does not have a guest pass will be escorted to the nearest gate.

(Remember, if your guests break any rules, YOU will be held accountable!) Your guests are YOUR responsibility!

Any watercraft used at Leisure Lake must have a current LLPOA registration and valid sticker attached within viewable site or you will be asked to remove it from the water immediately. Please report any violations to security or to any board member.

GARBAGE AND REFUSE

All refuse and garbage disposal is the responsibility of the individual LLPOA property owner and must be disposed of in a legal manner by all members. Any member found to have willingly disposed of refuse or garbage in an illegal manner will be subject to a fine not to exceed \$250.00 per incident. All appliances, furniture, construction material, etc. MUST be Disposed of by the member(s) at their own cost and NOT placed into the dumpsters. The use of LLPOA dumpsters is a privilege to LLPOA Members and paid for with your dues. Misuse of the dumpsters is becoming an issue and LLPOA will have no alternative but to either begin assessing members (\$250) for misuse or remove the dumpsters completely and the members will be responsible for procuring removal of their garbage at their own expense.
